Confession of Faith and Praise - The Scottish Confession¹

We confess and acknowledge one God alone, to whom alone we must cleave, whom alone we must serve, whom only we must worship, and in whom alone we put our trust. Who is eternal, infinite, immeasurable, incomprehensible, omnipotent, invisible; one in substance and yet distinct in three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost. By whom we confess and believe all things in heaven and earth, visible and invisible, to have been created, to be retained in their being, and to be ruled and guided by His inscrutable providence for such end as His eternal wisdom, goodness, and justice have appointed, and to the manifestation of His own glory. Amen.

¹ The Scottish Confession of Faith was written in 1560 under the leadership and influence of John Knox and other ministers in Scotland. It was presented to and approved by the Scottish Parliament as a refutation of catholic error and "a statement in plain and several heads, of the sum of that doctrine which they would maintain, and would desire to establish as wholesome, true, and only necessary to be believed and received within that realm."

Title: “Wherever You Go...There I AM”

The doctrine of the omnipresence of God is meant to bring great comfort to God’s people. No matter where we find ourselves , and no matter how overwhelming our circumstances may be - we can know that our God and Savior is with us.

while he is merely a deluded creature. It is even possible to have a self-righteous spirit about one's own humility...
